# BUILDING A FIRM FOUNDATION

#### WORD OF THE WEEK - THE TWO BUILDERS

Jesus said to his disciples, "Anyone who hears and obeys my teachings is like a wise person who built a house on solid rock. Rain poured down, rivers flooded, and winds beat against that house. But it did not fall, because it was built on solid rock.

Anyone who hears my teachings and doesn't obey them is like a foolish person who built a house on sand. The rain poured down, the rivers flooded, and the winds blew and beat against that house. Finally, it fell with a crash."

# Something to think about...

Matthew 7: 24 - 27

24 Therefore everyone who hears these words of mine and puts them into practice is like a wise man who built his house on the rock. 25 The rain came down, the streams rose, and the winds blew & beat against that house; yet it did not fall, because it had its foundation on the rock.

Output Lock

The word 'foundation' is related to the word 'fundamental', meaning something which forms a base from which everything else develops. It can also mean something that is more important than anything else. In a building the foundation is the most important part because it keeps the rest of the building stable. It is important for a building to be strong not only to protect the people inside it, but also the people and other buildings which surround it!



That is what Jesus is telling us in this week's Gospel passage; Jesus is encouraging us to put his teachings (love, peace, community, forgiveness) at the foundation of our lives. That way our lives can be like strong buildings – lives which allow us to be fulfilled and happy for ourselves, but also for those we share our lives with. If we ignore those values, then we become less useful, and sometimes even a danger, to ourselves and those around us. This week, as we move into the season of Lent, we can take a look at our own lives – what is fundamental to me? Do I live a life which is good for other people as well as myself?...
