Other Information

- All exams have to be taken in the same year – i.e. at the end of Year 11
- All exams have to be taken in the same tier – i.e. all foundation or all higher
 - All exams will cover any of the 5 topics covered during the course
 - All exams will make reference to the country or countries where the language is spoken – therefore it is important that you have an awareness of France and other French speaking countries and their cultures.
- The exams will use authentic material – i.e. adverts, poems, literary texts, emails, text messages – therefore it is important that you familiarise yourselves as much as possible with authentic material.
 - NO DICTIONARIES are allowed in any of the 4 exams



Topic 1: Identity and culture

- Who am I? relationships, friends and family, interests, role models
- Daily life: food, shopping, social media and technology
- Cultural life: celebrations and festivals, music, sport reading, TV

Topic 2: Local area, holiday and travel

- Holidays: preferences and experiences
- Travel and being a tourist: directions, accommodation, asking for help
- Town, region and country: weather, places to see, things to do

Topic 3: School

- What school is like: school types, school day, school subjects, rules and pressure, success.
- School activities: events, trips and exchanges

Topic 4: Future aspirations, study and work

- Languages outside the classroom
- Ambitions: further study, volunteering, training
- Work: jobs, careers, professions,

Topic 5: International and global dimension

- Bringing the world together: sporting events, music events, campaigns and good causes
- Environment: being 'green', access to natural resources

- Task 1 will cover topics 1-4 but would not be topic 5 – however task 2 and 3 could be so this topic will still need to be revised and covered for the speaking exam.

Additional Information

For each task on the speaking exam there is a separate mark scheme.

Task 1: Role play (10 marks)

A score between 0-2 for each prompt that is on the role play card.
There will be 5 prompts on each role play card

Task 2: Picture Card (24 marks)

- There are two areas of the mark scheme:
1. Communication and Content (0-16 marks)
 2. Linguistic knowledge and accuracy (0-8 marks)

Task 3: Conversation (36 marks)

- There are two areas of the mark scheme:
1. Communication and Content (0-12 marks)
 2. Interaction and Spontaneity (0-12 marks)
 3. Linguistic knowledge and accuracy (0-12 marks)

- The writing paper is designed to allow you to show off exactly how well you understand French, can give opinions, use tenses and manipulate the language.

Q3: Pick one from a choice of two. Narrate, give opinions and convince reader. Use informal register.

Q4: Translate 5 sentences into German

Q1: Pick one from a choice of two. Narrate, give opinions and convince reader. Use informal register.

Q2: Pick one from a choice of two. Note down key points and convey information and justify ideas. Must use the formal register.

Q3: Translate a short passage from English into German.
