THE GIFTS



GOLD

Was presented to the child Jesus, symbolising his role as King.

Frankincense



Was a valuable resin that was extracted from tree bark. When burnt, this gum gave off a sweet smell, this was used by the Jews in worship

Myrrh

Was another resin, sweet smelling and expensive. It was known to relieve pain, and used when preparing a body for burial.



The <u>Greek</u> epiphaneia derives from the verb "to appear" and means "appearance", manifestation". In classical Greek it was used for the appearance of manifestation of gods.

Story - The fourth wise man

There is a story of a fourth wise man who brought a sapphire, a ruby and a pearl to give to the new baby king. As he went to meet his companions he was delayed as he stopped to help a dying man. This meant he had to sell the sapphire to buy food for him.

He reached Bethlehem too late. Mary, Joseph and the child Jesus had gone to Egypt to avoid Herod. As Herod's soldiers killed all boys of two and under, the wise man gave the ruby to bribe a soldier not to kill a child.
