ROMANS 12: 2, 9-13

Do not conform to the pattern of this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your mind. Then you will be able to test and approve what God's will is- his good, pleasing and perfect will.

SOMETHING TO THINK ABOUT ...

Sometimes it easier to just conform and go with the crowd, but what if the crowd is doing the wrong thing? Can you think of a time when you have done something just to fit into the crowd?

Can you think of a time when you haven't said or done something to avoid being seen as different or to avoid a difficult situation?

Can you think of a time when you have not conformed and gone against the crowd because you knew that it was the right thing to do?

This week we are thinking about this and reflecting on the lives of St Peter and St Paul, who went against the crowd to do the right thing and spread Jesus' message.

St Peter was known as the rock because Jesus knew he was a strong person who could help spread the word about God. St Peter was tasked by Jesus to organise and support the disciples in organising the church.

St Paul traveled around preaching God's word and Jesus' message to all people, he traveled to dangerous places and spoke to all people about Jesus, risking his life.
