#### **Coronavirus Update**

I am aware that there is some concern about the potential effects that the spread of Coronavirus may have on the ability of All Hallows to stay open and to provide education to our pupils. We continue to follow the advice of Public Health England, Local Authority colleagues and the Department for Education (the DfE is currently sending a daily bulletin about the virus to schools nationally). At the moment we continue 'business as usual', however, the school's Senior and Middle Leaders have put together a business continuity plan in readiness, should we be forced to close in the future. In the event of the situation worsening we would communicate our plan in a timely fashion.

In the meantime I would urge you to talk through the advice which is readily available on measures which can be taken to prevent the spread of the disease, particularly with regard to the regular washing of hands. Finally, I would like to state that, despite rumours to the contrary in the local press, no confirmed cases of Coronavirus are connected to any persons, child or adult, linked to All Hallows.

Stem Fortnight continues next week at All Hallows with a range of students in all year groups taking part in a variety of in school and out of school challenges and competitions which will be linked to the theme of 'British Science Week – Our Diverse Planet'.

### **Tomorrows Engineers EEP Lego Robotics Competition**

On Tuesday this week, the hard work of a group of Years 7-9 paid off when they took part in the regional heats of the Lego Robotics Competition. 1 of 14 schools taking part in this heat (63 schools in the North West have taken part overall) they worked well as a team from the moment they walked into the iSTEM Centre at Preston's College. They took part in a range of challenges from executing tasks with their own robot, a blind team challenge set on the day, delivered a spectacular presentation which aimed to resolve an environmental issue the world faces and raced a speed robot. On the day they won the Presentation Award and came 2nd overall. They were due to take part in the UK final on Friday 13<sup>th</sup> March 2020 however a decision has been made to cancel the whole event including the Big Bang Fair. We understand that the students will be disappointed, however this is out of our control.
