- 6. Which parts of Asia are the most sparsely populated? Find a picture if you can.
- 7. Which Asian country had the one-child policy?
- 8. When did the one-child policy start and end?
- 9. Find a population pyramid for Afghanistan and one for Japan. Paste into your document if you can. What is different about the 2 pyramids?
- 10. Which Asian country is likely to grow the fastest in the future?

Year 9

We are continuing to study Glaciation and how ice changes the world. So far in this topic you know:

- ✓ How ice changes the world, what glaciers are + the different types
- ✓ How and why glaciers form and move
- ✓ Glacial processes eg freeze-thaw + plucking
- ✓ Glacial erosion landforms eg u-shaped valleys, corries and arêtes
- ✓ Glacial deposition landforms eg moraines, drumlins, erratics + outwash
 plains

This week you will investigate how people use glaciated areas. Answer in full sentences.

Task

The Lake District

- 1. Where is the English Lake District? Try to find a map to include in your work.
- 2. When did people start to visit the Lake District? How did they arrive?
- 3. What attracted the early visitors to the Lake District?
- 4. What attracts visitors to the area today? Try to find out about both physical and human attractions.
- 5. How do people travel to the area today? What problems might this cause?
- 6. Why may there be conflict between visitors and local people in the area? Find examples.
- 7. Other economic activities also take place in the Lake District. eg farming, quarrying and water storage/transfer. Try to find out one fact about each one of these and include some information in your work.
