Revision and 'Catch up' Plans

The government announced £1 billion of funding to support children and young people to catch up lost time after school closure. This is especially important for the most vulnerable and disadvantaged backgrounds. This funding includes:

- a one-off universal £650 million catch up premium for the 2020 to 2021 academic year to ensure that schools have the support they need to help all pupils make up for lost teaching time
- a £350 million National Tutoring Programme to provide additional, targeted support for those children and young people who need the most help, which includes a schools programme for 5 to 16-year-olds

To ensure all our young people have the opportunities to fill gaps in their studies and get the support they need to achieve the grades that they are capable of, we have put together a package of opportunities for all pupils to engage in as they progress into next year.

All Hallows Revision and Catch-Up plan will take three levels

Level 1 – Departments respond to changes in the curriculum and plan their time to enable gaps to be filled, support to be provided and the completion of the specification at KS4.

Great teaching is the most important lever schools have to improve outcomes for their pupils and teachers will have training and support to adjust to changes- particularly around changes in technology, modified delivery and resources. Ongoing assessment will be used to target gaps and inform lesson planning.

Level 2 – Departments will provide after school sessions, live online sessions, recorded sessions and 24/7 online learning materials to **all** students to reinforce and support revision of areas of the specification.

Level 3 – The school will identify a number of students who may require more intense support and 'catch-up' due to specific difficulties and disadvantage. These students will be offered tutoring in individual subjects to allow them to have a greater chance of achieving their target grades.

Level 1 began on return to school in September with **Level 2 and 3** planned to begin in December/January and February of the New Year.

Revision Programme - Prior to the Mock Examinations (**Level 2**) **Post Lockdown 2nd December**

The current government guidance allows schools to hold revision sessions after school where this is linked to supporting pupil achievement and progress and is particularly encouraged for disadvantaged pupils. Due to the numbers of Covid-19 positive tests in the local community, where possible we aim to deliver online however where specific software or equipment is required this will be delivered in school.
