The Baptism of the Lord



MARK1: 7-11

In the course of his preaching John the Baptist said: "Someone is following me, someone who is more powerful than I am, and I am not fit to kneel down and undo the straps of his sandals. I have baptised you with water, but he will baptise you with the Holy Spirit.' It was at this time that Jesus came from Nazareth in Galilee and was baptised in the Jordan by John. No sooner had he come up out of the water that he saw the heavens torn apart and the Spirit, like a dove, descending on him. And a voice came from heaven, 'You are my Son, the Beloved; my favour rests on you.'





Eternal Father, who at the baptism of Jesus revealed Him to be Your Son, anointing Him with the Holy Spirit: grant that we may be faithful to our call as Children of God, listening to you, guided by Your Spirit, to fulfil our unique and definite purpose. Amen. This week we hear about Jesus' baptism in the river Jordan. Jesus was baptised just before he went into the desert for 40 days, where he was tempted by the devil. We face temptation in our lives but by walking with God throughout our lives and making changes in our lives so we are able to grow and make the right decisions. We will be able to face temptations boldly, knowing what the right things to do is.
