WORD OF THE WEEK

Mark 9: 33-38

They came to Capernaum, and after going indoors Jesus asked his disciples, "What were you arguing about on the road?" But they would not answer him, because on the road they had been arguing among themselves about who was the greatest. 35 Jesus sat down, called the twelve disciples, and said to them, "Whoever wants to be first must place himself last of all and be the servant of all." Then he took a child and had him stand in front of them. He put his arms around him and said to them, "Whoever welcomes in my name one of these children, welcomes me; and whoever welcomes me, welcomes not only me but also the one who sent me."

In this week's Word of the Week the disciples argue about which of them was the greatest, and Jesus called them out on it. He completely turned the tables on their and our perception of greatness and said, "Make yourselves last. Put other's first.'

FAITH IN ACTION


Throughout the bible we see examples of how Jesus and his disciples put others first. Take a moment to think about what you could do this week to put others needs before your own.

ST CAMILLUS

Camillus was a big man with a bad temper. He never minded a fight and he was not particularly concerned about who he fought. So, for eight years, he became a soldier of fortune, fighting for whoever was prepared to pay him. He was also a born gambler and eventually lost everything that he had. To earn some money, he found word as a labourer, helping to build a monastery.

It was then that his life changed. As he watched the monks, he decided he too would ike to do something that was useful for a change. He tried to join the Francican Friars (a group of monks) but he was unable to do so because of a disease in his leg resulting from an old battle injury. He decided that he might be able to help those who suffered as he did and so he attached himself to a hospital. He soon discovered what shocking places hospitals were- filthy, ridden with disease and having brutal people nursing the sick.

In 1584, Camillus became a priest and leader of a band of men, known as Ministers of the Sick, who pledged themselves to help the sick and injured. Camillus sent out the first unit ever to tend the injured on the battlefield. His followers wore a Red Cross.

When he died in July 1614, he has about three hundred others, all pledged to do this great work. Today he is known as St camillus, the patron saint of nurses and the sick and his feast day falls on the 18th July each year.

GOD ALWAYS PUTS US FIRST

It is a real challenge for us to think of others instead of ourselves, but our God always puts others first. He does what is best for us every minute of every day. When he sent Jesus to leave heaven and come to earth, he was thinking of us. When Jesus died on the cross, God was thinking of us.
