



## Word of the Week Luke 1: 18-25

This is how Jesus Christ was born. A young women named Mary was engaged to Joseph from King David's family.

But before they were married, she learned that she was going to have a baby by God's Holy Spirit. Joseph was a good man and did not want to embarrass Mary in front of everyone. So he decided to quietly call off the wedding.

While Joseph was thinking about this, an angel from the Lord came to him in a dream. The angel said, "Joseph, the baby that Mary will have is from the Holy Spirit. Go ahead and marry her. Then after her baby is born, name him Jesus, because he will save his people from their sins."

So the Lord's promise came true, just as the prophet had said, "A virgin will have a baby boy, and he will be called Immanuel," which means "God is with us.

After Joseph woke up, he and Mary were soon married, just as the Lord's angel had told him to do.

In the difficult times in our lives we should trust God knowing that he is in control and will look after us. This Advent we are invited to trust in God as Mary and Joseph did.





## SLeeping St Joseph

While asleep, St Joseph received messages from God. We read about one of these times in this week's Word of the Week. But there is also another instance when Joseph receives a message from God in his sleep. God appeared to Joseph and warned him about the danger posed by King Herod. God entrusts Mary and Baby Jesus to Josephs loving protection. Because of the courage and care of St Joseph he is known as the guardian of the Family.

Pope Francis has a statue of sleeping St Joseph on his desk in his office in the Vatican. "So when I have a problem, a difficulty, I write a little note and put it underneath St Joseph, so that he can dream about it! In other words I tell him: pray for this problem!" says Pope Francis. St Joseph is a truly special saint, who protects and helps us even while he sleeps!

Advent is a good time for letting go of our worries and troubles and anything that is bothering us. So like Pope Francis take a moment to write down, on a piece of paper or in a space in your planner, of any worries, concerns, problems, or prayers that you would like St Joseph to sleep on.
