### **Drama Skills**

In Year 8 Drama pupils will be learning new skills and techniques of theatre and performance, as well as developing and honing their skills learnt from the last year. They will be recapping on previous skills learnt in year 7 to embed and enhance the use and knowledge of these prior skills. Character development through movement and vocal skills, linked to both a stimulus performance work and themed contexts as well as scripted work, will also be developed through role play, rehearsal and improvisation activities.
