Please see below a message from Mrs Walsh with regard to this year's D of E.

We have been delighted to receive such an incredible response to our invitation for the Year 10 DofE Award. Over the half term break, myself and Miss Consiglio will be liaising with the national DofE operations team to enrol all participants onto the DofE platform, ready for them to start attending regular meetings with us after the half term.

As outlined in the information evening, pupils are required to complete 3 sections in addition to their expedition; Skill, Volunteering and Physical. The skill can often be quite challenging for young people to organise so we would like to invite a maximum of 28 students to enrol onto a free "First Aid Course" that myself and Miss Consiglio will be running at school one lunchtime a week for 12 weeks (the required length for completion of the skill section). This is an excellent opportunity for our DofE participants, and we are expecting that there will be a high demand.

The Growing Concern About 'Vaping'

I am sure that you have become only too aware of the national concern which has been raised recently about the increasing levels of 'vaping' among young people. Unfortunately, we have to report that All Hallows is not immune from this problem. Large numbers of our pupils do not wish to be associated with the habit and have distanced themselves from areas, particularly toilets, where the 'vapers' tend to congregate. However, a small minority continue to indulge in the habit, which is both harmful and off-putting for those pupils who genuinely wish to use the toilets. We have found a number of 'vaping' machines secreted in the toilets, which have been confiscated and destroyed. I must appeal to parents to unite with us in the fight against 'vaping', and to stand firmly alongside us as we issue severe punishments to those who continue to be out of bounds to enable them to 'vape'. We have made it clear to pupils, who claim not to 'vape', that sanctions will also be issued to those pupils who choose to congregate out of bounds to associate with those who are known 'vapers'.
