The 27th January is a day on which we remember the millions of people murdered during the Holocaust, under Nazi persecution and in the genocides which followed in Cambodia, Rwanda, Bosnia, and Darfur. As staff and pupils we have spent time in prayer this week reflecting on these atrocities, the sacredness of every human life and committing ourselves to stand against prejudice and hatred today to ensure that atrocities like this never happen again.

During the week their assembly and form time prayer has inspired pupils to pray, create posters and create a video to help others to pray on Holocaust Memorial Day.
