

The Baptism of the Lord



At that time Jesus arrived from Galilee and came to John at the Jordan to be baptised by him. But John tried to make him change his mind. Amen. This week the Church celebrates Jesus' Baptism in the river Jordan. Baptism is fresh start, when we are made new in Christ. Jesus was baptised just before he went into the desert for 40 days and nights where he was tempted. We in our lives face lots of temptations but by walking with God throughout our lives, and making changes in our lives so we are able to make the right decisions, we will be able to face those temptations boldly, knowing what the right thing to do is. The start of a new year provides opportunities for us to be made new, it gives us a chance to start a fresh, to make new resolutions to grow. This new year isn't about being a whole new person but about making the changes we need to make to be the best versions of ourselves.
