Royal Society Young People's Book Prize Judging 2023

We were extremely lucky this year to have been accepted to take part in the judging of 6 STEM based books as part of the Royal Society's Prizes for 2023. A group of pupils from across Years 7, 8 & 9 all joined together to read each of the books on a weekly basis. They were able to share their experiences of reading the book, what they liked or did not like, the facts or stories that they gained knowledge from and much more. They were able to take part in activities linked to the books which included things like writing a poem and creating art work ideas from microscopic bacteria pictures.

The books that the pupils were able to read were Beetles for Breakfast, and other weird and wonderful ways to save the planet, Fantastically Great Women Scientists and their Stories, Fourteen Wolves, How was that Built?, If the World were 100 People and Microbe Wars. Judging took place in which the book voted as top was How Was That Built? closely followed by Beetles for Breakfast. These books will now be available to pupils to borrow from the library after half term.

Year 9 Savio House Retreats.

Over the last two weeks three groups of Year 9 pupils have been on retreat to Savio House. The theme of their retreat is water, encouraging them to look under the surface of their lives and look deeper at four areas, home, school, friends and God. During the first day they took part in a number of icebreakers, getting to know each other better and the team of volunteers at Savio House. The first day also included a walk up to White Nancy and the final session was a reflective Well drawing session inviting the group to think about the sunshine and rain cloud moments in their lives. The evening concluded with time in small groups to share with each other these moments and night prayer. Day two was a packed day which started with a meditation morning prayer before going back into small groups to prepare for their reconciliation service, completing an examination of conscience. The reconciliation service in the afternoon was a reflective and emotional time, where the whole group prayed for each other and reflected on their own relationship with God. Everyone in the group was offered an opportunity to receive either the Sacrament of Confession or a blessing. The afternoon and evening of day 2 was the celebration part of our retreat, taking part in group games and preparing for the highlight of the retreat, our retreat Mass. The Mass included dance, drama, music and art work all prepared by our Year 9 pupils. All three of the Masses were a true celebration of what it means to be young and of thanksgiving. The day concluded with a karaoke disco enjoyed by all, including the staff, night prayer and again time to journal about the day. Day three, the final day of retreat brought together the whole of our retreat, in small groups they affirmed each other, writing positive and true things about one another and the retreat concluded with a beautiful time of prayer preparing us to go back to our normal lives by asking each of us to think about what we had enjoyed about the retreat, what we have learnt about ourselves and what we are going to take back with us.

One Year 9 pupil said that following the retreat she "felt different and had come back to school with a different approach, felt happier and positive."

Thank you to Savio House for leading us through three fantastic retreats and thank you to all of our Year 9 pupils who attended for your enthusiasm and your joy.
