## **History France and Belgium Trip**

On Friday the 26th May 55 Year 9 and Year 10s travelled by coach to France and Belgium for the History Department WWI Battlefields Tour. Mr Jenkins started the tour in France, where the students explored the sights of Paris and were fortunate enough to spend a day at Disneyland. The third day of the tour saw students visit key battlegrounds, cemeteries and memorials connected to the battles of Arras and The Somme. A visit to the Wellington Tunnels provided extra insight into the role that the members of the Commonwealth played in Britain's victory over Germany in 1918. Day four saw the students travel to Belgium where they visited the museum of Passchendaele where they were able to explore a reconditioned trench system from the battle of Passchendaele. Later the group paid their respects at the German Langemark cemetery and British Tyne-cot memorial, laying wreaths for the fallen. The tour concluded with the students visiting the Menin Gate, where the party participated in the Last Post ceremony in the town of Ypres. This ceremony is performed every night in memory of those who lost their lives in the war. Lauren C (Y9) and Alexander B (Y10) laid a commemorative wreath at the gate during the performance of the Last Post. The students had a very busy tour but as ever their impeccable behaviour made for an enjoyable trip and a fantastic time was had by both staff and students; thank you Year 9 and 10.



## **District Athletics Championships**

On Friday 16th June, the district athletics championships were held at Stanley Park,
Blackpool. The sun was shining, and it was set to be a great sporting event for all involved.
There are 11 South Ribble schools that entered teams into what has become one of the most prestigious competitions in the district. Over 500 athletes took part, displaying an exceptional amount of talent, in what was once again a fantastic meeting. We took 70 athletes from All Hallows who all produced excellent individual and team performances with several not only winning their events but breaking district records as well!

## Further Maths - Year 11 Students

In January 2022 we launched Further Maths as an optional extra for our GCSE students. Il pupils attended extra lessons every week and worked rigorously to achieve this incredible Level 2 Qualification. Working towards this extra qualification not only helped pupils prepare for Maths at A Level, but also significantly strengthened their understanding and application for their main GCSE in Mathematics. With this in mind, we made the decision to start Further Maths after school sessions from September 2022 for our current Year 11 cohort. Again, we were overwhelmed by the commitment and rigorous work ethic of all the students who signed up to the Further Maths programme. After months of extra sessions every Friday after school, our cohort of 17 Further Mathematicians sat their first exam on Thursday 8th June. On June 20th, whilst most of their peers were enjoying the start of their long Summer holiday, they all came into school for another revision. Pete Tiltman from LuSOM (Lancaster University School of Mathematics) very kindly offered his time to come in and work with the pupils, helping them with some key topics including factor theorem, binomial expansion and trigonometric equations (featured on the photo).

Many of our current Year 10 cohort have already shown a great interest in attending Further Maths sessions next year. These will officially begin in September 2023, however we are planning a few taster sessions before the Summer break to give pupils an insight into the content and challenge in store. With a 55% increase in numbers from our first year, we are excited to see the Further Maths programme at All Hallows' continue to flourish.

Thank you to Pete and Mrs Ormerod who have supported me in delivering this programme, and a huge well done to our Year 11s. We are all immensely proud of you and wish you great success in all your future pursuits in mathematics.

## Science with Mr Ringrose

## Shakespeare Folio 400 Visit to Eton College



On Tuesday, 13th June, fourteen Year 10 students embarked on the long journey to Windsor to take part in Eton College's Shakespeare Folio 400 Event alongside three other visiting schools.

As the solo representatives from the north, we were travel-weary on one of the hottest days of the year, but we were welcomed with lunch in the oldest part of the college. After refueling, students attended a lecture by Professor Emma Smith, Professor of Shakespeare Studies at Hertford College, Oxford. Then it was time to visit the College Library, which contained the display of Eton's copy of Shakespeare's First Folio, which was completely open for us to peruse. Impressive enough on its own, we discovered on arrival that they actually have an original copy of all four of Shakespeare's folios: the third is actually the rarest, due to most unsold copies being lost in the Great Fire of London.

The students all gained some valuable context for their study of Shakespeare and there may even be one or two of the boys who will be tempted to apply for an Orwell Scholarship to attend Eton College for Sixth Form, which has been won by two of our boys in successive years prior to our trip.
