

### What information have Year 11 pupils already received?

In lower (Year 7-9) school pupils follow a CEAIG programme which begins to prepare them for the world of work. This focuses on:

- Their personal interests and activities and how they help promote employability
- Using the online careers library to help discover access to a huge range of careers
- Recording personal achievements and skills to help build a strong CV
- Cross curricular opportunities to make subjects link to future possible employability choices.
- Opportunities to engage in an Options Fair
- Guidance on option choices during Personal Development

### Year 11 Careers - Pathways to Further Education

At All Hallows, part of our Year 11 curriculum is designed to prepare pupils for the move into Tertiary Education. During this year, pupils will be provided with a great deal of information, help and support to make this transition as smooth and as successful as possible. Our aim is to give pupils the skills and knowledge they need to find the right courses or employment for them in the next stage in their education.

During Year 11 there will be...

- Visits by representatives from Newman, Runshaw, Myerscough, Preston College and Hutton to talk to Year 11 pupils
- · Opportunity for a personalised interview with our independent career advisor Mrs Ayrton-Parker
- Class time/Form time allocated for the production of personal statements
- · Instruction on the process of completing online applications to colleges
- · One to one support and lunch time drop in sessions
- . Enrichment Day in December will focus on Careers/Interview skills/ Apprenticeships etc.
- Advertisement of all the weekend and evening open days at the local colleges.
- · A mock interview evening (January)
- Support from the YPS (Young People's Service) for pupils who need particular support during the transition to college
- · Recommendation of organisations and local employers who provide apprenticeships
- · Provision of college and university prospectuses
- · A notice board providing all relevant information about careers, colleges and apprenticeships
- · Attendance by Newman College at Parents' Evenings
- Drop in sessions at lunchtime by Cardinal Newman and Runshaw Colleges during the Spring Term.
- · Opportunity to attend a local Careers Fair.

### **A-levels** are the traditional qualifications that are offered by schools and colleges for students aged between 16 and 19.

A-levels usually focus on more academic subjects. There are more than 40 different A-level subjects on offer – some will be subjects that you studied at GCSE and others may be new.

A-levels are academic and highly valued by employers and universities so they can open up lots of doors to further study and careers.

### How do A-levels work?

You usually study three or more A-levels over two years, then sit exams Students choose which A-level subjects they want to study when they are doing their GCSEs, and admission is usually dependent on your GCSE grades.

You generally need at *least five GCSEs at grades 4-9* to be able to take A-level subjects. Sometimes you also need a 6 or above at GCSE in the subject you want to take at A-level.



VTQ (Vocational Technical Qualifications) include BTECs, Cambridge Nationals, Cambridge Technicals and T Levels. These provide the opportunity to *gain hands-on experience in a field or subject*, and are a viable alternative to the more theory-focused, classroom-based ways of learning which you might be put off by.

BTECS and other VTQs can be an alternative path to both university and particular jobs in place of, or in addition to, A-levels.

BTECs often need *lower entry requirements* for college courses than traditional A Levels. GCSE grades can determine the level of entry onto BTEC courses.

BTECs also generate UCAS points (like A levels) and can support applications to University.










### **Year 11 Destinations** 2020








It is recommended they register with the government website so they can receive alerts which suit their criteria when apprenticeships become available


Some colleges offer apprenticeships directly through the application process. This would be separate to a college application.







In keeping with our commitment to provide students with outstanding careers guidance and tailored support when choosing their next step after school, we will now be using <u>Unifog</u>; an online careers platform. All students in Years 7, 8, 9, 10 & 11 now have access to this website.

The <u>Uniforg</u> platform is designed to support learners in making the most informed decisions about their futures and has a range of tools that are suitable for all year groups. Each student has their own personal account that provides a wide range of information related to their interests and aspirations. Key features of the platform include:

- Exploring Pathways personality guizzes, career and subject profiles, MOOCs and webinars
- Recording self-reflection about extracurricular activities and key employability skills
- Opportunities search tools showing live vacancies/courses/placements for apprenticeships, universities (in the UK and abroad), FE, virtual work experience and much more
- Applications tools to help students build applications for a range of pathways (e.g., CVs, Personal Statements, Common App Essays)

Students have already accessed the platform in school. To access <u>Unifforg</u> from home they need to log into <u>Unifforg</u> using their email address and password. They can do so from any computer, tablet or smartphone. We would encourage you to use the platform with your child so you can support them through the process of deciding their next step.

We have also set up a parent login so that you can use <u>Uniting</u> as if you were a student yourself, allowing you to support your child throughout the process.
