

Exam Dates

- GCSEs begin on Thursday 9th May 2024.
- Last exam on Wednesday 19th June 2024.
- Timetable to be published in coming weeks.



How the timetable works

- The aim is to give pupils revision sessions as close to the exams as possible.
- Green boxes are exams. But pupils must check their exam timetable in order to know if they are taking that exam!
- The purple boxes are the revision classes that they attend when they don't have an exam.



How it works

- Where there is more than one revision subject, pupils must attend the top one. If they don't do that subject, they go to the next one down.
- Teachers and Rooms will be displayed on the TV screen in the morning.
- Excellent standards of behaviour are expected in all revision classes.
- Where there is no exam or revision class then pupils go to the Senior Dining Room for supervised private revision.





Some pupils require additional support during their examinations.

This can be in the form of:

Extra Time

Pupils receive
25% extra of their
exam time

e.g. 1 hour exam becomes 1 hour 15 minutes

Reader

Pupils can ask for a word or sentence to be read.



Rest Breaks

Pupils can take a short break from their exam for medical or other reasons.

The missing time is added on to the end of their exams





The process for arranging access arrangements is overseen by the governing body JCQ.

They visit school annually and check that we have the appropriate evidence of the child's need.



Extra Time Process

Pupils filtered through reading tests and already identified SEN needs

Pupils are then tested by a qualified assessor for processing, reading and writing speeds.

Pupils must have a standard score of below 85 in two of the tests to qualify for extra time

All Other Arrangements

For a pupil to have another access arrangement we need to have evidence of need

e.g. medical letters, diagnosis of a condition

This should also be their regular way of working in school.





Other Agencies

Sometimes, a pupil may need some additional support from outside agencies such as CAMHS, the school nurse, the Police or Children's Social Care.

We work closely with a wide range of outside agencies to support the pastoral care, health and wellbeing and safety of our pupils.

We also use the Lancashire "Early Help Referral" to access additional support where required.






