# All Hallows' Year 9 Students Reach for the Stars in STEM Day

In a bid to inspire the next generation of engineers and innovators, 47 All Hallows' Year 9 students embarked up on an exciting STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering, and Mathematics) day. The event was made possible by the collaborative efforts of Create Education, and the generous support of BAE Systems, Lancashire's biggest engineering employer. The focal point of the day was an introduction to industrial-standard Computer-Aided Design (CAD) software to create and 3D print rockets. Beyond the rocketry, the students received invaluable career advice and gained insights into the world of engineering.

During the day there was the opportunity for the students to learn how to use industrial-standard CAD software to design their own rockets. Under the guidance of experts from Create Education, students were able to conceptualise their rocket designs, manipulate dimensions, and visualize their creations in 3D. This hands-on experience not only ignited their imaginations but also provided them with a glimpse into the sophisticated tools used by professional engineers.

Once the CAD designs were complete, the students were shown how to bring their creations to life using 3D printing technology. The process of 3D printing gave the students an understanding of the connection between digital design and physical production. They learned the importance of precision and accuracy in engineering, as well as the potential of 3D printing in various industries.

All Hallows' recognises the importance of providing students with hands-on STEM experiences. STEM education plays a vital role in shaping the future workforce and fostering innovation. It equips students with essential skills like problem-solving, critical thinking, and teamwork, which are highly sought after in various industries.

Throughout the day, students were also treated to a wealth of career advice and insights into the world of engineering. Representatives from Create Education shared their personal journeys and offered guidance on potential career paths in the field. The students had the chance to ask questions, seek advice, and gain a deeper understanding of the exciting possibilities that await them in STEM-related careers. A great day was had by all involved.

### Dear Parent/Carer,

This letter is to inform you/ remind you that our school is participating in the Operation Encompass partnership scheme, between local school, academies, colleges, community health agencies, and Lancashire Police.

Operation Encompass was set up to provide early reporting to schools about any domestic abuse, Missing from Home or other incidents that occur outside of school hours to which a young person attending our school has been exposed, and which might then have an impact on their schooling the following day. This information will be shared throughout the year, including school holidays and the weekends.

Information will only be shared with the school by the police where it is identified that a young person was present, witnessed or was involved in an incident to which the police were called.

A nominated member of college staff, known as an Encompass Key Adult, has been trained to liaise with the police. They will usually be school Designated Safeguarding Leads (DSLs) and/ or deputy DSLs, They will be able to use information that has been shared with them, in confidence, to ensure that the school is able to make provision for possible difficulties experienced by children or their families. The Key Adults will keep this information confidential, and will only share it on a need to know basis, for instance, to teaching staff for the child or young person. It will not be shared it with other school students.

Operation Encompass was first introduced in Plymouth in February 2011, and has proved very effective in providing appropriate and timely support to young people affected by domestic abuse. This initiative has been implemented across the whole of the Lancashire Police area. If you would like some more information about it, you can view it online at www.operationencompass.org.

We are keen to offer the best support possible for our pupils and a recent review of Operation Encompass showed that it is beneficial and supportive for all those involved. Yours sincerely,

# Manchester Jewish Museum Visit

We went on a Year 8 RE trip to the Manchester Jewish Museum. When we got there we were amazed at the look of the outside. It is a big building with the Star of David on the wall at the top. We were greeted by two guides who took us through the learning room and into the place of worship – the synagogue. The synagogue was originally used as a place of worship for the Jewish community, but when the community moved away it closed down and stopped being a working synagogue. It was in excellent condition considering its age and there were so many interesting and well-kept artefacts to see. We got to investigate the layout and the items in the synagogue before making some videos to explain our findings.

We spent some of the morning in the learning room looking at artefacts – some were over a hundred years old. We learnt about what Jewish males wear when they pray and got to handle the shofar horn that is blown in the synagogue in the lead up to, and on Rosh Hashanah (Jewish New Year). The museum part of the trip focused on Judaism in society today and we got to do a treasure hunt to find answers. There were stories and artefacts of people who had escaped the Holocaust and it was interesting to investigate individuals and what they had gone through.

The guides were very welcoming and kind and were more than happy to answer our questions. It was a very positive experience and we would recommend it as a day trip to anybody.


