# All Hallows Fabulous Achievement at VEX IQ Robotics

Nine talented students from All Hallows—six from Year 8 and three from Year 10— have had a brilliant robotics-based start to STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering and Maths) month. With success at VEX IQ which is the world's biggest schools-based robotics competition.

The VEX IQ competition is a rigorous contest that tests students on their ability to design, build, program, and control robots to complete a series of challenges. It is a true test of their STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering, and Mathematics) skills, creativity, and teamwork.

Our students' hard work and dedication at STEM club throughout the year resulted in two teams building robots to complete a challenge called <u>Full Volume</u>.

The first test for the students and their robots was to take part in the Northwest heat. Students travelled to Alderley Edge Girls Grammar School to compete on Thursday, 8th February. Facing stiff competition from five other teams, some of which journeyed from as far away as London, our students rose to the challenge, showcasing their exceptional abilities in robotics. Their work paid off spectacularly as the All Hallows teams clinched both 1st and 2nd places, securing their spots at the National Finals in Telford. This was the first time All Hallows had qualified for the UK finals. It was a massive achievement.

Our teams then had 3 weeks to prepare to compete against the best in the UK for one of the two coveted spots at the World Championships in Texas, USA.

The UK Finals were based at the International Centre in Telford, where the 60 best robotics teams took part in over 200 robotics matches against one another using a mixture of coding and driving skills to score as many points as possible.

The competition was held over 2 days (Sun 3rd and Mon 4th March) which meant our All Hallows students had to contend with 5am starts, 8pm finishes and 8 hours of intense competition sandwiched between 2-hour drives to and from Telford.

As well as the competition, there were constant interviews and scrutiny from the scores of judges and engineers that had come from all over the world to assess the robots. Matches were played in arenas with crowds of up to 600 watching; as well as being live streamed on the internet to the world.

Despite the highly pressurised situation, our All Hallows students did brilliantly in all of their matches. They worked well in their teams and spoke eloquently and knowledgeably to the judges during interviews. They used complex problem-solving skills under intense pressure to fix and improve their robots and code throughout the competition. Overall, they finished in 17th and 21st position which is a phenomenal achievement considering it was our first experience of National competition.

A huge congratulations to Will W, Edward W, Harrison R, Eoin W, Ethan C, Oliver B, Jack B, Matthew C and Henry B.

This achievement is not just a testament to their prowess in robotics but also highlights the importance of STEM education and careers. By engaging in such competitive events, students gain hands-on experience that not only bolsters their academic knowledge but also prepares them for future careers in these crucial fields.

Looking ahead, our teams will now prepare new robots for next season's events which start at the beginning of May 2024.
