Year 11 Leavers' Assembly

This week Year 11 celebrated the end of their time here at All Hallows with a leavers' assembly. This followed on from leavers' Mass celebrated by Fr Ian, which marked the beginning of their exam period. Our Head Boy and Head Girl, Ryan and Rebecca, began the assembly by looking back over their time at All Hallows since September 2020. They made reference to the COVID restrictions the year group started high school with, being in 'bubbles', social distancing, split lunches, sanitising and wearing masks. We looked back at Y11's involvement in Chaplaincy over the five years and talked about great memories on retreat at Lowe House in Year 7, Castlerigg in Year 8, Savio House in Year 9 and Castlerigg again in Year 10. We heard about the important role Y11 students have played in the Catholic life of the school, through being involved in the SVP and Faith in Action, collecting food for local homes and delivering it, and raising money for CAFOD and the Metanoia homeless project in Preston.

The sporting achievements of the year group were also highlighted, including memorable sports days, football tournaments in Year 9 and 10, winning netball and handball tournaments, along with successes in athletics at Stanley Park and UCLAN. Success in STEM club, especially in the world of VEX Robotics was highlighted along with 3 of the year group who were part of the national STEM finals in Telford. Y11 pupils have visited schools across Lancashire to compete, share ideas and show off coding and engineering skills.

Trips abroad have been a real highlight and pupils talked about their memories of the New York & Washington Performing Arts and Science trip in 2023, the History trip to the battlefields in France and Belgium, and the West Coast of America trip in 2025. Pupils looked back on Duke of Edinburgh expeditions throughout their time at school.

Y11 pupils also talked about their love of being involved in the Frozen and We Will Rock You musicals, with many Y11's playing lead roles, singing, dancing and working in technical support.

The assembly included performances from the Y11 rock band, and many of our Y11 singers, dancers and performers. Even the form tutors got on stage with tambourines and maracas to support Mrs Caw's appearance as a lead singer for the rock band! It was a brilliant celebration which ended with a word of thanks and a presentation for Y11's wonderful Head of Year, Mrs Hodgson, who has guided the pupils with love and compassion through their All Hallows School careers to Grow Together in the Spirit of Christ's Love.

We ended with a prayerful reflection, using Matthew's Gospel to leave Year 11 with a final teaching: 'Therefore I tell you, do not worry about tomorrow, for tomorrow will worry about itself. Go forth into the world in peace, show love to everyone, love and serve the Lord'.

These cutting-edge environments are usually off-limits to visitors outside the defence sector and gave the girls a unique insight into advanced manufacturing, robotics, and aerospace technology at the highest level.

After the event they were invited to drop in to the Heritage Centre they became the first ever young people to receive a guided tour. Where incredible stories were shared about the people, places, products and companies who have formed part of BAE's history and contributed to their success over the years.







<u>Please Use the Forgotten Items Box</u>


We'd like to kindly remind all parents and carers about the Forgotten Items Box that has been placed outside the main school entrance.

This system was introduced to reduce classroom disruptions and allow our office staff to manage their workload more effectively. Despite this, we have noticed an increasing number of parents continuing to press the office buzzer to drop off items, which makes it difficult for staff to carry out their responsibilities throughout the day.

We ask that all forgotten items (e.g. PE kits, books, lunchboxes) be clearly labelled and placed in the box. The box is checked regularly—at 8:55 am, break time, lunchtime, and 3:05 pm—and items are delivered promptly to students.

Please support us in making this system work by using the box rather than pressing the buzzer, unless it is a genuine emergency.

Your cooperation is greatly appreciated—thank you for helping us minimise interruptions to the school day and keep things running smoothly.

If your child is feeling unwell, please do follow health guidance, but if they are able to attend, their presence is invaluable.

PLEASE TAKE THE TIME TO READ THE UPDATED NATIONAL CHANGE TO PENALTY NOTICES AND PROCEDURES FOR UNAUTHORISED ABSENCE. THIS APPLIES FROM AUGUST 2024.

Important Update – Changes to Education-related Penalty Notices Information for Parents

You may be aware that the Department for Education has recently announced national changes to penalty notices issued for unauthorised absence in term time. These changes will come into effect on 19 August 2024.

The changes to be aware of are:

- Penalty notices issued for offences that take place after 19 August 2024 will be charged at a new rate of £160 per parent per child. This can be paid at £80 if paid within 21 days.
- · Any second penalty notice issued to the same parent for the same child within a rolling 3-year period will be issued at the rate of £160 to be paid within 28 days with no option for a discounted rate.
- The threshold at which a penalty notice must be considered is set at 10 sessions (equivalent to 5 days) of unauthorised absence within a rolling 10-school week period1. This may include absences as a result of arriving late after the register closes. The 10 school weeks may span different terms or school years.
- A maximum of 2 penalty notices may be issued to a parent for the same child within a rolling 3-year period, so at the 3rd (or subsequent) offence(s) another course of action will need to be considered (such as prosecution or one of the other attendance legal interventions).
- · Only penalty notices issued for absences taking place after 19 August 2024 will count towards the above thresholds.
- · Pupils who are late after 9.00am will receive a 'U' code which is classed as an unauthorised absence. Lates are classed as unauthorised absences and will count towards the fines.
