



WORD OF THE WEEK

MOTHER TERESA (ST TERESA OF CALCUTTA)

The patience, kindness and humble spirit that we associate with being truly loving could be seen in Mother Teresa of Calcutta. She was a nun who went to India to teach Geography. When she saw the poor and sick on the streets of Calcutta she decided to leave the security of the convent and to retrain as a nurse, to work amongst the sick and the dying. She had to beg for medicine and for a room to treat patients. She took in the dying, the lepers and the unwanted children.

Mother Teresa could have been the president of her charity, sitting in a fine office away from the poor and dying. She could have lived in the finest house and worn the finest clothes. But instead She spent over fifty years helping the poor, the sick, and the dying, telling them by her life, and by her words , that they are loved.

CORRIE TEN BLOOM

As you can imagine, after the war there was a lot of hatred between people and between nations. There was a lot of hurt and a lot of forgiveness was needed. Corrie Ten Bloom was a Dutch women who had suffered in Ravensbruck Concentration Camp because she and her family had hidden Jews from the Nazis. Her father died in prison and her sister in the camp. Yet after the war Corrie travelled to Germany to speak about God's forgiveness. At a church in Munich she recognised a former prison camp guard. She vividly remembered all the horror, anguish and humiliation she suffered the last time she saw him. He did not recognise her, but conscious of the part he played in the war he approached her and asked her forgiveness. She did not want to shake his hand; she just felt the coldness as she stood there. Eventually, she mechanically put out her hand and they shook hands. Only then did she feel the love of God flow through her to him.
