### Word of the Week Luke 16:19-31 The Rich Man and Lazarus

There was a rich man, who was clothed in purple and fine linen and who feasted sumptuously every day. And at his gate lay a poor man named Lazarus, full of sores, who desired to be fed with what fell from the rich mans table; moreover, the dogs came and licked the poor mans sores. The poor man died and was carried by the angels to Abraham's bosom. The rich man also died and was buried; and in Hades being in torment, he lifted up his eyes and saw Abraham far off and Lazarus in his bosom. And he called out, 'Father Abraham, have mercy upon me, and send Lazarus to dip the end of his finger in water and cool my tongue; for I am in anguish in this flame.' But Abraham said, 'Son, remember that in your lifetime you received the good things, and Lazarus received the bad things; but now he is comforted here, and you are in anguish. Between us and you a great chasm has been fixed – and no one can cross it.' And the rich man said, 'I beg you Father Abraham, to go to my brothers and warn them, so that they do not come into this place of torment'. But Abraham said, 'They have Moses and the prophets. Let them hear them'. But the rich man cried, 'No, if someone goes to them from the dead, they will repent'. Abraham said to him, 'If they do not hear Moses and the prophets, nor will they be convinced if someone should rise from the dead'.

## How can we put the Word of the Week into action?

The word of the week highlights to us how we should live our lives – with compassion, kindness and generosity. It makes us sit up and think about others and the world around us. We think about the Lazarus's of the world – those who are living in poverty, destitute and dying of starvation. Do we recognise them? Do we do enough to help them? Do we think of those who suffer when their crops fail during this time of harvest? Do we think about the story behind the homeless we pass or do we think they are not worthy enough? Do we turn our TV over when yet another advert comes on asking for donations? Are we like the rich man? Do we show compassion to those who are suffering and in despair? Or are we only bothered about our own wealth and greed?

As a supporter of CAFOD, our school can make a big difference to those who suffer. By giving even the smallest amount individually we can make a difference as a community. So, think hard this week. What can you do to support CAFOD? On Friday we support the CAFOD Harvest Fast Day, a day when we can go without something in order to help others. What will you go without? Will you say an extra prayer for those who are in need? Will you spare a few pennies to help?
